 - i. Group to support families of those struggling with same-sex-attraction meets 2x a month, and members are screened before joining. This group started within New Covenant, but has spread to include multiple churches.
 - ii. What the church needs to understand about helping families of those with SSA:
 - 1. There is no hierarchy of sin: homosexuality is not "worse" than teenage rebellion or self-righteousness
 - 2. In counseling those with SSA, the focus must be on surrendering impulses and desires to the Word of God: this is common to all believers.
 - a. Remember that focus is not to counsel those with SSA to heterosexuality, but to holiness
 - 3. The impact on a family is heavy, grieving is difficult and the church can help families by rallying around them.
 - 4. Most gay children want either "love" (complete acceptance) or "truth" (full separation) from family and friends.
 - 5. The church must have a safe, comfortable place for teens (and adults) to admit real struggles.
 - 6. Have a clear theology on same-sex attraction within the church.
 - e. Heart conditions to work through with families of those struggling with SSA
 - i. Guilt, shame, identity, truth, etc.
